Key Text

Psalm 127 (NKJV)

Unless the Lord builds the house, They labor in vain who build it; Unless the Lord guards the city, The watchman stays awake in vain.

² It is vain for you to rise up early, To sit up late, To eat the bread of sorrows; For so He gives His beloved sleep.

³ Behold, children *are* a heritage from the Lord, The fruit of the womb *is* a reward.

⁴ Like arrows in the hand of a warrior, So *are* the children of one's youth.

⁵ Happy *is* the man who has his quiver full of them; They shall not be ashamed, But shall speak with their enemies in the gate.

Framework

• Genesis 1:27—

"So God created man in His *own* image; in the image of God He created him; male and female He created them."

Why Family? Why Now?

- Family is a crucial aspect of "End Time" message of God's Church (Malachi 4:5-6; Luke 1:17)
- Family is one of the greatest avenues for manifesting God to the world, e.g., Abraham (Genesis 12:2-3)
- Family has the power to shape our destiny (e.g., Noah and Achan)
- Family is under attack by the Enemy of our Souls (Revelation 12:17)

Key Features of the Psalm

- Superscription: A Song of Ascents. Of Solomon
- A pilgrimage Psalm attributed to Solomon
- Type: Wisdom Psalm—concerns for practical wisdom
- Type: Royal Psalm—concerns for the kings reign

Points to Ponder

THE LORD MUST BUILD THE HOUSE (Bayith)

1. The Lord must guide in the selection of a spouse

- 2. The Lord must guide in the building of a family
- 3. The Lord must guide our family values
- 4. If the Lord were in charge of the building of my home, how would my hope be different?

THE LORD MUST GUARD THE CITY

- 1. The Lord is the only security for our homes
- 2. The Lord must set the boundaries of our homes
- 3. The Lord is the only the shield and protection from our homes
- 4. The Lord's altar must be at the center of every home

OUR THE BEST EFFORTS VOID OF DIVINE GUIDANCE ARE UTTERLY FUTILE (in vain)

- 1. Short-sighted investments—here and now
- 2. Chasing after the wind—twisted values
- 3. Hypocritical perspective—do as a say and not as I do
- 4. The reality of the Great Controversy—souls are at stake

"CHILDREN ARE A HERITAGE FROM THE LORD"

- 1. Hebrew word *nachalah* means "inalienable, hereditary possession, inheritance, patrimony, or property"
- 2. The Lord entrusts parents with His nachalah
- 3. Parents and guardians are stewards of Yahweh's precious, priceless treasures

Lessons from 'Lost' Children in the Bible

- Eli's sons (1 Samuel 2:12, 17)
- Samuel's sons (1 Samuel 8:1-3)
- Two of Aaron's lost sons (Leviticus 10:1-2)
- 1. The nurture and teaching of Yahweh's *nachalah* cannot be left to chance or taken for granted
- 2. Destinies are at stake

Lessons from 'Missing' Children in the Bible

- Moses' children (Exodus 4:20; 18:1-6)
- 1. The plight and perils being gifted
- 2. The super-hero syndrome
- 3. Ignoring Yahweh's *nachalah* to do the Lord's work or to pursue our "calling" can leader to far reaching consequences

Priceless Treasures

- Samuel (1 Samuel 3)—Balancing Nurture with Devotion
- *Nurturing the next generation of priests/priestesses and prophets/prophetesses*
- Josiah (2 Kings 22:1-2)—Balancing Instruction With Honor
- *Nurturing the next generation of rulers*
- Timothy (2 Timothy 1:5; 3:14)—Balancing Teaching with Modeling
- Nurturing the next generation of spiritual leaders
- Jesus (Luke 2:41-52)—Balancing Discipline With Affirmation
- *Nurturing the next generation of sons and daughters of God*

The Charge

- Priceless treasures must be given back to God. They must be nurtured to hear and respond to God's voice (Samuel)
- Priceless treasures must be intentionally nurtured in the fear and admonition of the Lord. Godliness must be taught and modeled (Josiah, Timothy)
- Priceless treasures must receive a well-rounded education and must be prepared to be about their "Father's Business"
